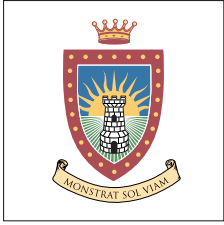


HARNWELL COLLEGE HOUSE



The House coat of arms was designed in 2000 by Kei Yamamoto who also proposed the House motto, *Monstrat Sol Viam*, meaning "The Sun Shows Us the Way."

Harnwell takes its name from former Penn President Gaylord Probasco Harnwell (1953-70). The House calendar is rich with events that cultivate warm and cozy communities within this 24-floor high rise. Weekly traditions include *Monday Night Probasco Family Dinner* followed by *Chocolate Chat*, *Wednesday Movie Nights*, *Thursday Evening Makin' Break*, and *Sunday Game Night*. Harnwellians anticipate beloved events such as *Monthly Dean's Teas* and the *Annual Sapphire Ball* in September.

A wealth of artistic endeavors thrive in the House — including music master classes, Salsa dance lessons, and performances by the *Underground Shakespeare Company*. Concerts in the Rooftop Lounge have featured musicians from the Blutt College House Music Program, Penn Jazz, the internationally-renowned cellist Matt Haimovitz, and Indian sitar music.

Harnwell has facilities to support every kind of activity. There is a dance studio with a sprung hardwood floor, a computer lab with adjacent library, and a versatile basement called "the Dungeon" with a small theater, music practice rooms, and a fitness center. The mezzanine houses the Café du Soleil, while the Rooftop Lounge is equipped for events and performances. With renovations completed in the summer of 2007, Harnwell's room suites feature newer appliances, private bathrooms, and a lounge on each floor. Students enjoy a unique combination of privacy and freedom in apartment-style living. About 80 freshmen called Harnwell home in 2008-2009; some chose to join a Residential Program, others live together in the freshman community on the 7th, 8th, and 9th floors close to the House Dean and other advising staff.

Ancient Studies/University Museum

Supported by the Center for Ancient Studies and Penn's Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology, residents avail themselves of Penn's rich resources in ancient civilizations, art history, and museum work. [Comprises 8% of House population.]

Arts House Program

Arts House nurtures both community and individual expression in visual arts, music, theater and dance. [Comprises 8% of House population.]

East Asia Program

The East Asia program attracts students interested in the languages, cultures, and societies of Asia, as well as the experiences of Asians and people of Asian descent in the U.S. [Comprises 4% of House population.]

Franklin Community Residential Program

Members of the Franklin Community cultivate a learning and living community open to sophomores, juniors and seniors. As individuals and a collective whole, they seek to develop leadership skills that will aid in the negotiation of complex cultures. [Comprises 2% of House population.]

International Program (IP)

The International Program (IP) provides a living experience for people wishing to meet other international students like themselves, first-generation Americans, or Americans wishing to learn about other cultures. [Comprises 8% of House population.]

Latin American Program

Established by students in 1985, the Latin American Program fosters an appreciation for Latin American languages, politics, forms of cultural expression, and most importantly, a sense of community. [Comprises 4% of House population.]
